Dear Friends, Pentecost marks the end and the goal of the Easter season. It is a memorial of the day the Holy Spirit descended upon the apostles and the Virgin Mary in the form of fiery tongues, an event that took place fifty days after the Resurrection of Jesus. The Paschal Mystery — the

Passion, the Death, the Resurrection, and the Ascension of Jesus — culminates in the sending of the Holy Spirit by the Father (at the request of His Son), on Jesus' disciples. The feast also commemorates the official inauguration of the Christian Church through the apostolic preaching of St. Peter, which resulted in the conversion of 3000 Jews to the Christian Faith. Pentecost is the official birthday of the Church.

Acts of the Apostles describes in detail the miraculous transformation that took place during the first Pentecost, thus fulfilling Jesus' promise to his apostles that they would receive "Power from on high." The first manifestation of their reception of the Holy Spirit came immediately, as the formerly timid, frightened apostles burst out of doors and began to proclaim the Good News of Jesus! Then, everyone there (regardless of their many different native languages), was able to understand the Apostles' proclamation of the Good News of the salvation of mankind, "in his own tongue." The Jews in the crowds came from sixteen different geographical regions.

St. Paul explains how the sharing of the various spiritual gifts of the Holy Spirit enriches the Church. They are described as the gifts, fruits, and charisms of the Spirit. Today's Gospel passage also tells us how Jesus gave to the Apostles the power and authority to forgive sins. "Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained" (Jn 20:23). The presence of the Holy Spirit with the gift of forgiveness, is referred to directly in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. It reminds us of the Christian vocation we have, to love and forgive as we have been loved and forgiven by God.
