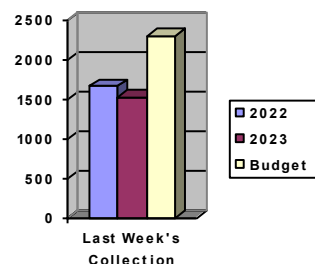

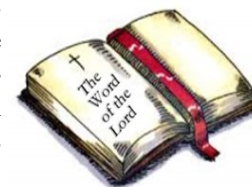
We are in great need of Sacristans, Lectors & Choir members

Florence St. Vincent de Paul Society Report

for October, November and December 2022

In October: 71 families were served through St. Vincent de Paul Activities and 112 adults and 8 children were served from the Pantry/Commodities and 2 people were helped with gas vouchers.



In November: 85 families were served through St. Vincent de Paul Activities and 121 adults and 4 children were served from the Pantry/Commodities, 1 person was helped with utilities and 1 with a gas voucher.

In December: 71 families were served through St. Vincent de Paul Activities and 97 adults and 13 children were served from the Pantry/Commodities, 1 person was helped with rent, 1 person was helped with utilities, 1 person was helped with a gas voucher and 1 person was helped with prescriptions.

In addition, 2 families were helped with car repairs, 1 person with a bus ticket, 2 people with clothes from the thrift store and 38 families with 86 children for gifts and food for Christmas.
