Friends, today we begin a new liturgical year-with the season of Advent, a time of hopeful waiting, quiet preparation, and spiritual awakening. Advent is not only about preparing for Christmas; it is about preparing for Christwho comes to us daily and who will come again in glory. Advent is a wake-up call. St. Paul

speaks with urgency: "It is the hour now for you to awake from sleep." It is God saying to each of us: Wake up to the grace that is available. Wake up to the love you may be overlooking. Wake up to the purpose you may have forgotten. Wake up from spiritual laziness or routine.

In the Gospel, Jesus uses the surprising example of the days of Noah—not to scare us, but to teach us. People were eating, drinking, marrying—living ordinary life—but they were not paying attention to God's presence or His warnings. The danger in spiritual life is distraction. Being so caught up in the routine, the noise, the busyness, that we stop noticing God. Jesus tells us: "Stay awake." Not anxious or worried. Just awake attentive, ready, open-hearted. What Does an Advent Heart Look Like? It is a heart that chooses Hope over fear, Peace over anxiety, Light over darkness, Prayer over rush, Awareness over distraction, Preparation over procrastination. Advent is not about doing more— it is about being more attentive to God. A quiet prayer in the morning, a moment of stillness, an act of kindness, a word of forgiveness, these are the simple ways we get ready.

As the first candle of the Advent wreath is lit, may our prayer

"Lord Jesus, awaken our hearts. Make us walk in Your light.

Help us to stay awake and ready for Your coming."

May this Advent be a season of hope, renewal, and grace for all of us. Let us awaken our spirits and prepare for the Lord's coming with joy and anticipation.
