Friends, we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday today. In the Psalm we cry out a victory shout: "His mercy endures forever." As we journey through the season of Easter, we are reminded of the transformative power of resurrection and the promise of new life that it brings. Resurrection calls us to embrace the possibilities of

new beginnings, to let go of past mistakes, and rise above adversity. It is through the mercy of God that we can experience personal resurrection – be it in our relationship, habits, or attitudes.

The resurrection story teaches us the enduring love and mercy of God. By the blood and water that flowed from Jesus' pierced side, we've been made God's children. Yet we never met Jesus, never heard Him teach, never saw Him raised from the dead. His saving Word came to us in the Church - through the ministry of the apostles, who in today's Gospel are sent as He was sent. He was made a lifegiving Spirit and He filled His apostles with that Spirit. As we hear in today's First Reading, they bore witness to His resurrection with great power. And through their witness, handed down in the Church through the centuries, their teaching and traditions. We encounter Him as the apostles did - in the breaking of the bread on the Lord's Day.

St. John is trying to show us how the risen Lord comes to us in the liturgy and sacraments. "The doors are bolted tight, yet Jesus mysteriously comes. He greets them with an expression, "Peace be with you." He shows them signs of His real bodily presence. And the disciples respond by joyfully receiving Jesus as their "Lord." Let us approach the altar with joy, knowing that every Eucharist is the day the Lord has made. May God open our hearts to the transformative power of the Resurrection and experience the joy of new life in Christ.
