





Friends, the readings this weekend speak of rejoicing and celebrations after entering the promised land. The city wall of Jericho was destroyed by worship and praise. The Israelites celebrated Passover at Gilgal and ate the produce of Canaan. This marks a new beginning and God's fulfillment of His promises. Every-

one of God's promise to Israel is fulfilled to this day. The manna ceased, and they no longer had manna but ate the land's produce. It was Joshua who led the people finally to the promised land. Joshua is very much the type of Jesus the Christ. Joshua in the Old Testament and Jesus have similar missions. While Joshua fought the final battle to enter the promised land, Jesus won the definitive victory over sin and death, opening the way to eternal life.

Manna ceased in the Old Testament, but in the New Testament we have Jesus the true bread from heaven. Manna kept sustaining the people to journey to the promised land and now it is Eucharist that sustains our journey to eternal life. St. Paul says, in Christ, we are new creations. God reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the message of reconciliation. Be reconciled to God through Christ. In our eucharistic we celebrate all of this mystery and our victory. We celebrate our reconciliation with one another and the presence of Jesus that heals and redeems

The younger son's demand for his inheritance and subsequent downfall shows the consequences of rejecting God's gifts. The father's open-armed welcome upon the son's return illustrates God's boundless mercy for those who repent. God desires us to be in a loving relationship with Him, giving and receiving His gifts freely. The older son is resentful, but the father explains the need to celebrate the lost being found. Today we are invited to reflect on the gift of Eucharist in which we celebrate God's generous and unconditional love.
